SEPT 13th, 2023: Launch of BILIM.network - Digital Tool for Agroecology

<u>BILIM</u> is the first interregional digital platform focused entirely on Agroecology. Bilim means Knowledge in Turkish and some other Central Asian languages. The platform allows sharing knowledge in a way organised around 11 pillars of Nyeleni Declaration of Agroecology (2015).

The term 'Agroecology' appears more and more often during discussions of the post-war green recovery of agriculture in Ukraine as many stakeholders start to use it to describe one of the possible ways for more sustainable development. BOSNIA & HARCEGOVINA - ALICA Foundation

The ALICA Foundation is a formalized initiative for a community seed bank, agrobiodiversity and acroecology founded in 2021. The main activities include: on farm conservation, promotion of sustainable production and use of genetic resources; lobbying for farmers seeds and farmer's rights; promotion the traditional knowledge and practices; training and information exchange; participation in selection/breeding programs. Foundation is one of the founders and member of Balkan Seed Network and has recently signed an agreement with the Grassroot Institute (Canada) on general Partnership for Summer Field School (Hybrid) - FSC MER 2023 Mountain Ecosystem and Resource Management held from 10 - 19 September 2023 (see below).

ITALY - Schola Campesina: Bridging generations through knowledge sharing

Schola Campesina has been working on several projects concerning strengthening of inter-regional collaboration on agroecology. Among them is the new guidebook: "Bringing Generations in Agroecology through knowledge sharing", the result of the cooperation of 6 organisations from Poland, Germany, France, Netherlands, Italy and Switzerland active in the field of agroecology, implementing training, and other kinds of knowledge transfer activities. KOSOVO - Women's Association STINA from Kosovo region

Women's association "Stina" was launched in February 2016. Stina's trainings in the field of agriculture and rural development focus on horticulture, artisanal products, as well as medicinal-aromatic plants in particular, traditional foods and preservation of agricultural products. Read more.

POLAND - Agro-Perma-Lab: Polish Declaration on Agroecology nearing completion

The civil society consultation process on the <u>Polish Declaration (Statement) on Agroecology</u> has been initiated during pilot <u>Agroecology School training in 2019</u> and continued between 2020-2022 facilitated by the <u>Living Earth Coalition</u>. The declaration is an attempt to defend the complex vision of transformation of agri-food systems as defined by Nyeleni Declaration, which takes into account their social, ecological, economic and political aspects. Agro-Perma-Lab has also contributed to researching agroecological transition worldwide by <u>testing TAPE tool</u>.
